D²EPC is organizing a workshop related to our *Assessor manual* on the 12th of July for the Energy Performance Certification assessors from all over Europe

The purpose of gathering assessors from different EU members is to have their opinion on the project and implement the necessary changes to fit their requests. As one of the objectives of D²EPC is to standardize the process of EPC, having relevant stakeholders from different countries helps guide this project in that way.

The workshop will be divided into four different sections:
